Description Writing

Descriptive paragraphs strengthen evidence for a topic. Also, they emphasize or even *de*-emphasize action within an essay.

OBJECTIVES

- Compose a full, two page essay utilizing a description pattern. Use <u>at least</u> five sentences for each paragraph.
- 2. The subject should center around a weekend party you attended recently or a social gathering at a church, a community fund raising event, family reunion, or even a political rally.
- 3. What subjective or objective opinions did you experience? What setting or people can you describe in colorful, intricate manners? Fictional devices and colloquial language are encouraged.
- 4. Remember you must follow the standards for academic paragraph writing:
 - open with strong topic sentences
 - write 3 or more supportive evidence sentences
 - conclude with a statement summarizing or strengthening your point
 - avoid fragments and run-on sentences
 - double check your spelling

5. Allow only 2 passive verbs per paragraph.

- (avoid forms of the verb to be: is, am, was, will, would)
- 6. Use strong transitions between paragraphs.
- 7. Choose a specific organization structure to your essay.
- 8. State in the title which structure you used in essay:
